During this leave, I had the opportunity to work for the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs in preparing for and organizing the 15th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (“COP15”) held in Copenhagen in December 2009. Throughout the Conference, I served as Liaison Officer between the Ministry and the Mexican President Felipe Calderon Hinojosa. I was later admitted to represent Latin America and the Caribbean in an internship at the Legal Office of the Registry of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea and awarded the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) Grant. At the Tribunal I assisted with research on matters of Public International Law and prepared and reviewed various working documents for the Judges and lawyers of the Tribunal.
